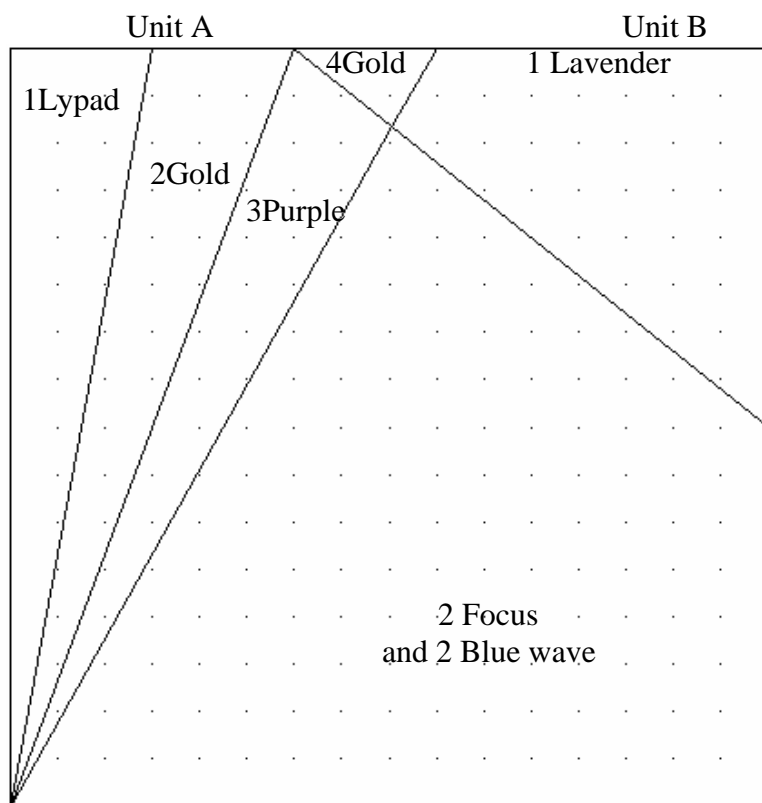


SIMPLICITY BOM #8

Page 2



1. Cut 8 squares from freezer or printer paper @ 5" square.
Using a light box or window, a ruler, and a mechanical pencil (the line width will affect block accuracy):
2. Trace 1 Unit A (1, 2, 3, 4) onto each of 4 squares and add a 1/4" seam allowance to all 3 sides of the Unit.
3. Trace 1 Unit B (1, 2) onto each of 4 squares and add a 1/4" seam allowance to all 4 sides of the Unit.

SEWING: Unit A

1. Fold and Crease the paper on the line between sections 1 and 2. Open and lay flat.
2. Center the fabric for section 1 **Right** side up on the **UM** side of the Unit.
3. Place the fabric for section 2 **RST** with section 1 fabric using the crease as a guide. Be sure that the right edge of the section 2 fabric is a bit more than 1/4" to the right of the creased guide to allow for seam allowance. See Tip #1
4. Pin and turn over so that the **M** side of Unit A is facing you and the fabric is against the feed dogs.
5. Sew along the line between sections 1 and 2 where indicated. It is perfectly OK to sew a stitch or 2 into the seam allowance.
6. Fold the paper of section 2 back (paper to paper) along the 1 / 2 line and use the Add-A-Quarter™ ruler to trim excess fabric away.

Place 1/4" lip up against the paper edge and trim excess from the seam allowance. Watch that you ONLY cut the seam allowance.

7. Press seam open. With the **M** side facing you, fold the line of section 3 back along the 2 / 3 line. Use the Add-A-Quarter™ ruler to trim the fabric of section 2 for a 1/4" seam allowance. You will now have an even edge to line up section 3 fabric to section 2 fabric, **RST** before sewing.
8. Turn layers over to **M** side and sew along the marked line between 2 and 3. Press seam open. Follow step 7 to prepare for adding section 4.
